Sixty (60) graduating DOST scholars of Region I converge at the Center of Teaching Excellence (CTEX) Hall, College of Teacher Education, MMSU last April 08, 2022 for an exit conference facilitated by the DOST Region I Office which aimed to reintegrate the values of the scholars and reorient them in relation to their commitment incorporated to their agreement with DOST-SEI.

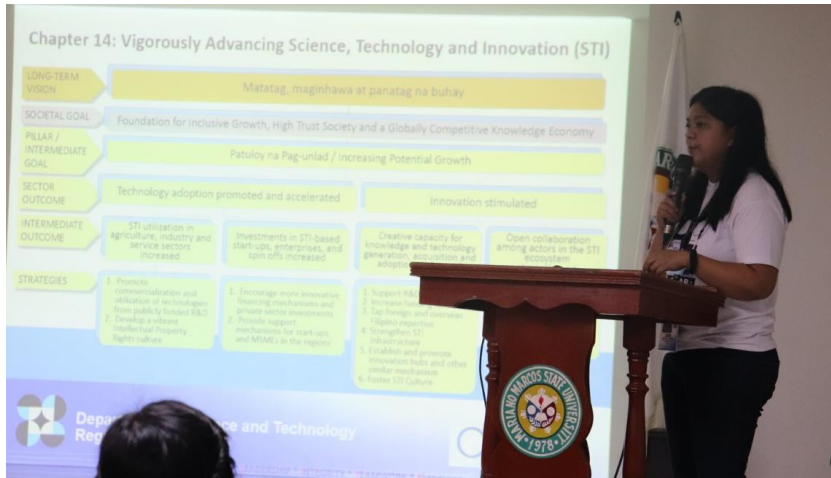

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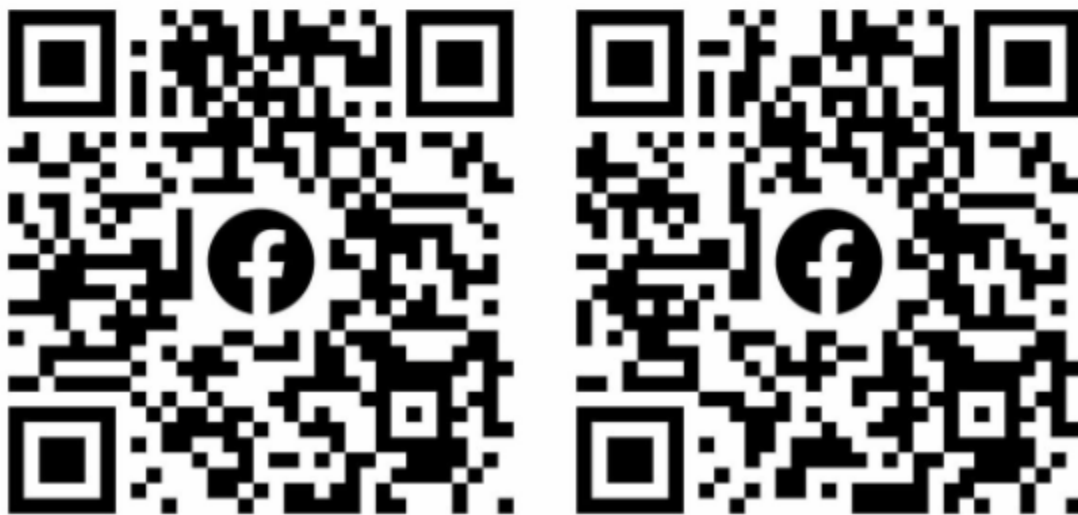

b. KALAHY-CIDSS Cash for Work Program

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N E W S / MMSU alumni jobseekers attend orientation for KALAHY-CIDSS Cash for Work Program

Two hundred twenty-five (225) MMSU graduates of the S.Y. 2022-2023 attended the orientation and registered as applicants for the Kapit-Bisig Laban sa Kahirapan-Comprehensive and Integrated Delivery of Social Services (KALAHY-CIDSS) Cash for Work Program (CFWP), a joint project by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and the Office of the Sen. Imee R. Marcos.

The program is designed to offer short-term employment opportunities for recent college graduates within local government offices, state universities and colleges, as well as DSWD offices in the province.

The orientation program, organized by the Institutional Student Programs and Services (ISPS) Unit of the Office of Student Affairs and Services (OSAS), took place at the MMSU Covered Court on November 14, 2023, at 9:30 AM.

The orientation session was conducted by Ms. Reysa D. Pilotin Tigas, the DSWD-CFWP Focal Person for Region I. During the session, she elucidated the mechanics and implementing rules of the Cash for Work program to the participants. Qualified applicants are set to be employed for a period of ninety (90) days, working eight hours each day, and will receive the daily wage rate applicable in the province.

Dr. Prima Fe R. Franco, Vice President for Academic Affairs of the University, who represented the University President in the said orientation, delivered the welcome message where she expressed her gratitude to DSWD and to the Office of Sen. Marcos for delivering such relevant service to MMSU graduates.

"This (program) is a significant benefit for our emerging professionals. This initiative is particularly impactful given the challenging job market in our province and across the country. The reality is that securing employment has proven to be a formidable task. However, with the advent of the KALAHY Cash-for-Work program, opportunities unfold before our MMSU graduates, offering swift access to meaningful employment.", Dr. Franco emphasized in her speech.

The applications of the 225 participants will be overseen by Dr. Jahnese D. Asuncion, Chief of ISPS and the appointed University focal person for this program. Her office works closely with DSWD Region I to finalize the deployment of the applicants. Additionally, MMSU 2022-2023 graduates who were unable to attend the orientation but wish to apply for the program can still express their interest to the ISPS Office. Dr. Asuncion is responsible for coordinating all applications with both DSWD and the local government units in the province.

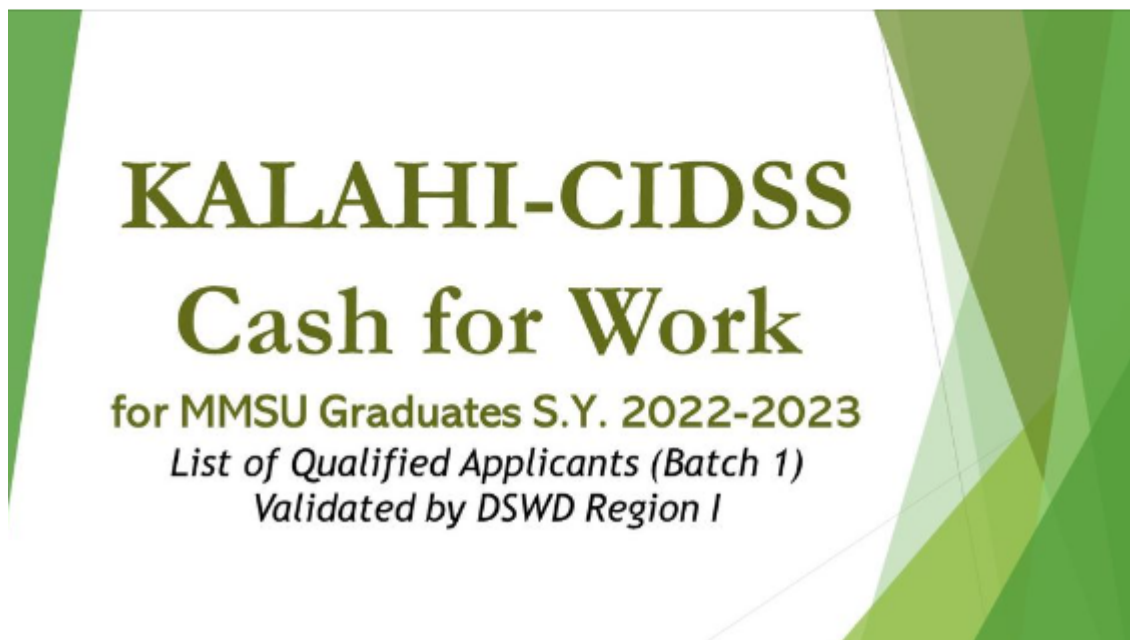
