

MMSU's Green Spaces: Public Access and Ecological Initiatives for a Sustainable Campus

Mariano Marcos State University (MMSU) provides free public access to its open and green spaces. The university's open spaces include parks, fields, and forested lands that are available for public use. Notably, the FEM Park and Oval are open for cultural and athletic activities such as sightseeing, walking, jogging, and public performances, while the beachfront at the Currimao campus is accessible for recreational purposes.

MMSU also focuses on increasing green spaces, as seen in the tree-planting initiative on August 1, 2023, led by University President Dr. Shirley C. Agrupis. This event, held around the Sunken Garden and University Library, planted 150 flowering and fruit-bearing trees to support MMSU's goal of an ecologically sustainable campus. Since 2018, MMSU has contributed to the "Green Wall of Ilocos Norte" and the National Greening Program, reinforcing its commitment to creating a healthy and vibrant environment.
