a.3 Samples Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for Business Owners

AGREEMENT FOR CONTRACTED OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING FOR MMSU STUDENTS

I, the undersigned: Aiza A. Inocente, with Telephone Numbers: 0995-641-1500, of legal age, Filipino citizen and with address at #16 Quiling Sur, City of Batac, Ilocos Norte valid identification A03-07-000058 and e-mail address kuletzjhed@gmail.com / patriciainocente@yahoo.com,

hereby apply to the Off-Campus Housing List of Mariano Marcos State University (hereinafter "university") for inclusion of the rental facilities (hereinafter "facilities") as contracted university Off-Campus housing for university students. I agree to be immediately bound to the university housing policies and regulations including the following:

1. Exercise every reasonable effort to maintain the MMSU Residential Living Standards and to inform residents of these standards, pursue compliance, and make a report to the university when notice is given or there is knowledge of or suspicion of a violation. By these presents, a copy of this agreement shall be made readily available to the university students and its provisions should be made known to the students by the Office of the Student Affairs and Services and the property owner.
2. Separate single men students and single women students. Any modification of the facilities' pattern of separating single men and single women requires written consent by the parents of the student and the Office of the Student Affairs and Services in order for the university contract to remain valid.
3. Provide information regarding current occupancy to the Office of the Student Affairs and Services, including tenant course and/or college, each semester/term for occupancy for statistical purposes.
4. Allow and give consent to post in the University website and other promotional materials the owner's information and the details pertinent to the housing facilities. In this regard the owner shall ensure that all descriptions, advertisements, or promotions of the facilities are accurate and not deceptive and exercise good faith, fair dealing, e.g., by refusing to rent to students based on year in school, discriminating based on potential graduation, and honesty in all relations with tenants. If an owner's or agent's dealings with students or the Office of the Student Affairs and Services have been misleading, deceptive, dishonest, unfair, or have been in bad faith, the university may withdraw its contract immediately.
5. Preserve the quiet enjoyment and peaceful possession of the rental unit by the tenant and use lawful procedures of notice and entry as stated in the rental agreement.
6. Practice no discrimination in the rental of the facilities on the basis of race, religion, color, national origin, or disability.
7. Provide tenants with copies of all rental agreements, addenda, rules, bills, and receipts for money paid in cash at the time of any agreement or payment.
8. Respond promptly to emergencies, urgent problems, or critical repairs on a contracted when becoming aware of them and work with due diligence to promptly complete the repairs or correct the problem.
9. The Office of the Student Affairs and Services may withdraw the university contract from the owner's rental facilities for failure to respond promptly or reasonably to student-tenant problems involving the condition of the rental facilities, violations of the Residential Living Standards, rental

agreements, and conflicts with roommates or other tenants and employees or family members of the owner, or for not working with due diligence to complete repairs or correct such problems.

10. Allow representatives of the university and government agencies and all other public safety inspectors to inspect all units of the facilities at reasonable times to determine compliance with this agreement or applicable law.

11. Maintain the facilities in accordance with all applicable laws or ordinances and with the applicable Minimum Specifications for university housing.

12. No monetary consideration is required from the property owners to be included in the list of off campus housing facilities. The university through the OSAS is likewise required to recommend the facilities in the list to its students.

13. Guarantee a safe and conducive facility suitable for an excellent study environment to the students keeping in mind that the university will give due recognition to facilities that housed an honor graduate.

14. That by being part of the recognized and accredited off-campus housing facilities grants the property owner the right to seek assistance from the university with respect to violation by the students of the terms of the housing contract subject to data privacy concerns and other existing laws, rules and guidelines.


15. Violation of any of the conditions of the contract by the landlord or their agent(s) may constitute sufficient cause for immediate revocation of the contract of the facility. In the event of such contract cancellation or in the event of failure to timely secure a contract, the landlord agrees that any student may elect to terminate the rental agreement with the landlord upon five working (5) days' written notice to the landlord. Student tenants are explicit third-party beneficiaries of this agreement and these provisions apply regardless of the terms of the rental agreement. The owner agrees to remit within five days the balance of any prepaid rental or deposit monies or both to any student electing to terminate tenancy after notification that the contract of the unit has been withdrawn or if the owner fails to finalize the contract by the commencement date of the student-rental agreement.

16. A University contract is valid unless withdrawn or revoked, and is not transferable.

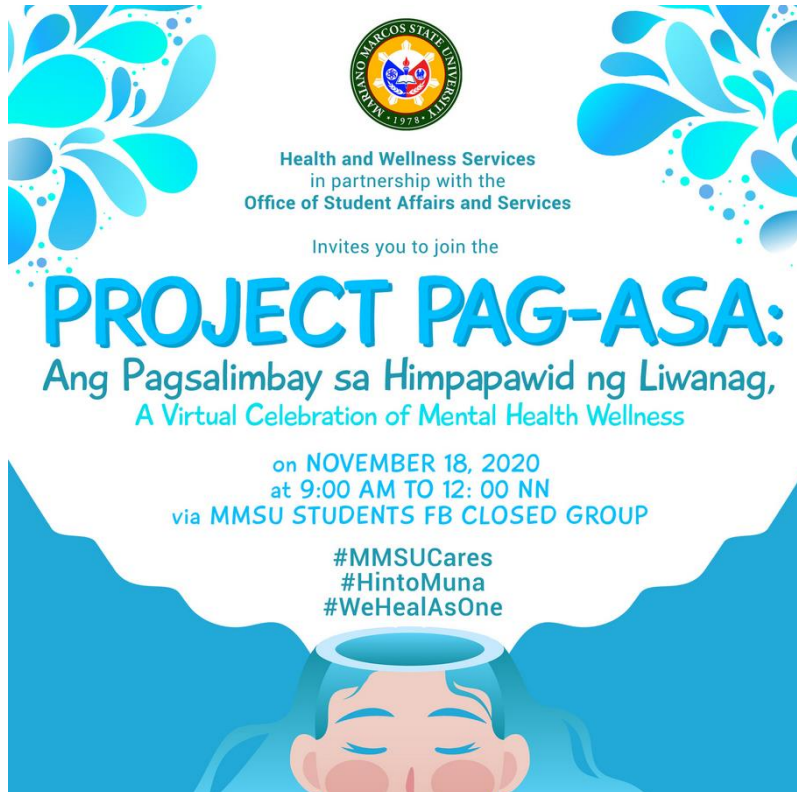
